

FORMATTING GUIDELINES FOR RESEAPRO JOURNALS

ABSTRACT

Each paper must start off with an abstract (with the exception of case studies, Editorial, Letter to editors). The abstract should be approximately 150-250 words and summarize the topic and findings of the paper. For Research Paper structured abstract will be preferred.

Once the manuscript is finalized, it should be submitted as an MS Word file (.doc or .docx). The document can be converted into PDF format for compilation of the journal and proceedings using Acrobat software. Careful compliance with these instructions will result in a professional and polished appearance.

KEYWORDS

You can add 5-6 keywords, separated by Semicolon (;). It should be in sentence case. E.g. Keyword 1; Keyword 2

Text Formatting

The following sections provide guidance to use this document as a template for the manuscript. For convenience, a summary of the key elements is provided below.

- Manuscripts must be prepared on A4-sized pages.
- The entire document should be formatted with 1.5 line spacing.
- Headers and footers should not be included in the manuscript.

- The text must be set in Cambria font, 12-point size, (except where different font sizes are specified for quotations, tables, and references).
- The manuscript text must be fully justified throughout, except for section headings, which should be left aligned.
- The title of the paper should be in sentence case, bold, left aligned, and formatted in 18-point font size.
- Author names must be presented in 12-point font, bold, and left aligned.
- Author affiliations should be written in 11-point font and left aligned.
- Appropriate honorifics and academic titles (e.g., Dr., PhD) should be included with author names.
- Main headings should be formatted in each word capitalization, bold, left aligned, and set in 14-point font.
- Subheadings must be in initial capital letters, bold, left aligned, and formatted in 13-point font.
- Each paragraph should begin with a first-line indent of 0.5 inch, except for the first paragraph under a heading (typically the default tab option).
- Additional blank lines between paragraphs should not be used, unless required to separate a distinct section of text.
- For manuscripts containing hypotheses, lists, equations, tables, figures, footnotes, or similar elements, authors are advised to follow the specific formatting instructions provided in the relevant sections of the guidelines.
- The reference section should be formatted in 10-point font with single spacing between entries, in accordance with the journal's reference style (see the section below for more instructions).

Headings

- Define "Heading 1 (Main Heading)" to be Cambria, 14-point, bold, Colour [Blue accent 1, Darker 25%], each word capitalization, and left aligned on the margins. Choose 12-point paragraph spacing after the paragraph.
- Define "Heading 2 (Sub Heading)" to be Cambria, 13-point, bold, Colour [Orange accent 6] Sentence case, and left aligned on the margins. Choose 6-point spacing after the paragraph.
- Define "Heading 3 (Sub Sub Heading)" to be Cambria, 12-point, bold, Colour [Black], Sentence case, and left aligned on the margins. Choose 6-point spacing both before and after the paragraph.

Formulae

When using formulae, you may want to use the software called Math Type. Just present the formulae the way you want them to appear in the final version of the manuscript.

Below we have inserted some references formulae just to serve as an example.

Tables

- Tables must be formatted in 10-point font, left aligned.
- Tables should have no vertical borders, with only a top border, bottom border, and a bottom border for the header row.
- Tables should be auto-fitted to the page width.
- Table numbers must be bolded.
- Table legends/captions should be placed above the table in 10-point font.
- All tables must be cited in the text of the manuscript at the point where they are first mentioned.
- Authors are encouraged to submit tables in their final, publication-ready format, reflecting how they should appear in the published article.

Figures

- Figures must be centered on the page.
- Each figure must include a title/caption for reference purposes.
- Figure numbers must be bolded.
- Figures should be of high resolution.
- Figure legends/captions should be placed below the figure and left aligned.
- Figure legends/captions must be formatted in 10-point font.
- All figures must be cited in the text of the manuscript at the point where they are first mentioned.

Disclosure Statement

Add Conflict of Interest, Acknowledgements, Author contributions and Funding details according to your manuscript.

References

- References should be prepared using Cambria font, 10-point size.
- All references must follow Vancouver style.
- List up to six authors, followed by "et al." when applicable.

- Journal names should be abbreviated and written without full stops.
- Include only the publication year (no month or day).
- Provide full page numbers for each reference.
- Ensure consistency and accuracy.
- A valid and working DOI must be included wherever available.

3. Website / Online Resource

Format :

Organization/Author. Title of page [Internet]. Place: Publisher; Year [cited Year Month Day]. Available from: URL

Example :

National Dairy Development Board. Breeds of cattle [Internet]. Anand: NDDB; 2021 [cited 2021 Dec 28]. Available from: <https://www.nddb.coop/information/breed>

Format :

Author. Title [type of thesis]. Place: Institution; Year.

Example :

Singh RK. Biodiversity assessment of tropical forests [PhD thesis]. Dehradun: Forest Research Institute; 2018.

Format :

Author(s). Title of paper. In: Title of proceedings; Date; Place. Publisher; Year. p. pages.

Example :

Kumar S, Patel R. Sustainable agriculture practices in India. In: Proceedings of the International Conference on Sustainable Farming; 2021; New Delhi, India. New Delhi: Springer; 2021. p. 45–52.

Format :

Book Chapter: Author(s). Title of the chapter. Book Name. Edition. Year: Page range. DOI.
